



Documentary/Environment. Oh, Canada!

A cinematic meditation on humanity's massive re-engineering of the planet. This is the third film in the directing team's spiritual trilogy which includes MANUFACTURED LANDSCAPES (2006) and WATERMARK (2013). This film follows the research of an international body of scientists who, after nearly 10 years of research, are arguing that the Holocene Epoch gave way to the Anthropocene Epoch in the mid-twentieth century because of profound and lasting human changes to the Earth. As unforgettable imagery is used to visually intersect art and science, this film manages to satisfy both the basic thirst for visual splendour at the cinema while tackling some of the most complex and reflective ideas that cinema is able to exercise. Who doesn't love when large scale documentaries dip their toe into such grand ideas where our own planet is observed into abstraction? This is what cinema was invented for.

BALLET NOW provides a rarely seen. unfiltered glimpse into the world of ballet and what it takes to create a one-of-kind dance extravaganza. Featuring New York City Ballet's Prima Ballerina Tiler Peck, who is the first ever woman to be asked to curate The Music Center's famed BalletNOW program, and a diverse cast of world-class dancers from around the globe, the film follows Tiler as she tries to execute her groundbreaking vision of mashing together the worlds of tap, hip-hop, ballet and even clown artistry. Armed with intense athleticism and an innovative approach. Tiler attempts to push boundaries and integrate unexpected elements into performances which will not only delight ballet's devout followers, but also create new fans. Summer jobs. Teen angst. Unrequited crushes, Heartache, John Psathas' BERNADETTE embraces these timeless themes as awkward protagonist Archie Kinsler (Sam Straley) struggles to earn the affections of the title character, an alluring 17year-old French lifeguard (Marilyn Bass). The spirit of 80's screwball comedies runs high in this film as hilarious references towards such films as CADDYSHACK, ANIMAL HOUSE, GHOSTBUSTERS and any film in the John Hughes filmography run rampant throughout the adventures that Archie's teenage crush propels him toward. Archie teams up with the local legends to teach him directly and indirectly about love, adulthood, and all the things that books can't teach. Classic tropes of 80's teenage cinema, such as jocks, stoners, nerds and parental figures round out the film through portraying the ever-cinematic ennui of suburban Chicago. True independent spirit and ingenuity is on display in this film as Psathas made this film on a shoestring monetary budget, but with the

BETWEEN LAND AND SEA

Documentary/Sports. World Cinema. BETWEEN LAND AND SEA charts a year in the life of Lahnich, a surfers' paradise town on the craggy coastline of County Clare. About a decade ago, big-wave surfers discovered the west coast of Ireland. Lahnich's waves are particularly ferocious and bring out the poetic streak in surfers. The film follows a handful of characters. There's Fergal Smith, a hippy-ish ex-pro who got sick of chasing energy drink sponsors and is now having a crack at organic farming. "I'm mad about growing spuds," he says cheerfully. Then there are the guys who run surf schools, whose precarious livelihoods depend on the 10week summer season not being rained off. This is a thoroughly engaging look at life at land's end, placing viewers inside colossal waves while emotionally connecting them with the athletes who ride them and the bucolic Irish town whose fortunes are at the mercy of the mighty Atlantic.

Drama. World Cinema. In CAPERNAUM. we are thrown into the world of. Zain, a twelve year old Beiruti boy, who has sued his parents and had them put on trial for giving him life and ushering him into the poverty, violence and chaos that surrounds his adolescent life. Though not a courtroom drama, the trial of Zain's parents structures the film around the fight for survival in the slums and shanty towns in Lebanon. CAPERNAUM exercises Labaki's storytelling prowess through its navigation of the loss of innocence and burgeoning pessimism without losing a childlike sense of escapism and emotionally stirring adventure. The appetite for 'guttersnipe' films which star precocious street kids, such as THE FLORIDA PROJECT (2017). TIGERS ARE NOT AFRAID (2017), and BEASTS OF THE SOUTHERN WILD (2012), is creating a trend in contemporary cinema of casting "non-professional" child actors in major lead roles.

Documentary/Food. CONSTRUCTING ALBERT is a film that provides an observational look at the inner workings of the restaurant industry. Ferran and Albert Adrià, two brothers from a poor suburb of Barcelona, gave birth to the most important revolution in culinary history. At fifteen-years old, Albert reluctantly started working with his older brother at his restaurant, the famous elBulli. Albert soon found cuisine to be an art he could express himself through. Living in the shadow of his brother, Ferran, the only recognition Albert has achieved is the title of the most underrated chef in the world. Decades later, and two years after the closure of elBulli. Albert is set to launch five new restaurants at once in a creative venture to bring Barcelona's crumbling theatre district back to life. THE EVOLUTION OF EIFF:

1986. Jan Miller launched Edmonton's LOCAL HEROES - an annual, multiday film festival that showcased Canadian, international and local cinema in February. Generously supported by the National Screen Institute (NSI), the festival was instrumental in launching the careers of a handful of Canadian filmmakers.

1999. The NSI gives notice that they will be moving *LOCAL HEROES* to Winnipeg. A group of passionate filmmakers and industry professionals launch a grassroots campaign to continue the tradition of an annual celebration of cinema in Edmonton. They apply for status as the Edmonton International Film Festival Society.

2002. The final year with the NSI and the first year as Edmonton International Film Festival.

2003. The EIFFS Board of Directors moves the festival from February to September, placing it within the existing Canadian film festival circuit, which goes like this: TIFF, Atlantic Film Festival (Halifax), Cinéfest (Sudbury), CIFF, EIFF and VIFF.

TODAY. By 2003 all of the NSI employees and contractors had moved on. With a new brand, a new time of year and a team of people who knew a lot about making films (but very little about producing a festival), EIFF has soldiered on -- as EIFF -- for the past 15 years. So how old are we really? You decide.
